I would like to take great pleasure in offering our New Year's greeting.

Last year, the Japanese economy showed a gradual recovery trend in general, but the recovery level varied in individual cases, depending on business type and size. Improvement in earnings of exporting companies influenced by the lower yen, as well as the expansion of inbound consumption, had a positive impact on economic conditions. On the other hand, many SMEs had difficulty improving their performance due to increased material and personnel costs and a serious labor shortage.

I hope that this year will be a milestone year in which the Japanese economy recovers from its long downturn and gets back on track toward strong growth again. To achieve Prime Minister Abe's strategy of "three new arrows of Abenomics," we are required to quickly establish a business environment that enables companies to take proactive approaches for fostering new fields and new businesses, and to adopt even stronger policies to attract investment both from home and abroad.

The Kansai region boasts a variety of strengths and potentials that can boost active communication and interaction among people and companies, such as Kansai International Airport, to be newly operated by the private company, and the clusters of universities and other institutions engaged in state-of-the-art research. We must focus on these values once again, polish them up and work toward them being widely recognized both in Japan and around the globe.

For example, Osaka and Kansai share a fertile environment that enriches knowledge, wisdom, culture and lifestyle, as seen in the clusters of SMEs with unique technologies and world-class academic and research institutions, attractive towns where domestic and international tourists gather, rich traditional cultures varying from foods to visual and performing arts, and historical and economic exchanges with the Asian region. We can exploit

To achieve this, it is necessary for us to maintain close contact with Osaka Prefecture and Osaka City, as well as the national and other local governments and agencies, and Kansai-based economic bodies. I believe that, through enhanced partnership and cooperation with all of these players, we can continue conducting fruitful activities.
